SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS SELBY AND DISTRICT MOTOR CLUB'S ELVINGTON STAGES RALLY

- The Selby & District Motor Club will organise a National B
 Permit Multi-use Stage Rally on Saturday 2nd September 1995,
 at Elvington Airfield, York, map reference 105/681.5 485.5
- The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the R.A.C. Motor Sports Association Ltd., (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FISA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions that the organising club may issue for the event.
- RACMSA Permit Number has been applied for.
- The event is open to:

 a) All fully elected members of the organising club and b)

 Members of clubs affiliated to the:

 Association of Northern Car Clubs and/or the Association of North East Midland Motor Clubs.
- All competitors and drivers MUST produce a valid Competition Licence, and Club Membership Card.
- 6)
 The event is a round of :- the Ridings Trophy.
- The programme of the meeting will be:
 Scrutineering including a noise check will start at 06.00hrs,
 on 2nd September. Scrutineering will be on site, follow the
 marshals instructions, (The NAAFI may be open for hot
 snacks).

Individual times for scrutineering will be notified in the Final Instructions. K23.1.1 and K23.1.2 will apply. Any competitor not signed on 45 minutes before their due start time may be excluded.

The first car (car 1) starts at 09.15 hrs.

8)

Cars will start at one minute intervals (30 second starts have been applied for). Map number 105 (1:50,000) will be required to locate the venue. The finish will be at the Yorkshire Air Museum. The event will contain a maximum of 10 special stages totalling at least 50 miles. These stages will be timed to an accuracy of less than 1 minute in accordance with K14.3.8. The stages will take the form of sealed airfield roads.

9)

The event will consist of 4 classes as follows:

Class(A) * Up to and including 1300cc

Class(B) * 1301cc up to and including 1600cc

Class(C) * 1601cc up to and including 2000cc

Class(D) Over 2000cc.

* Note: For classes A, B and C, all BD, twin cam per bank of cylinders engined cars will be placed in the next class higher than their actual engine capacity. Engine capacity will be deemed as that stated in the RAC vehicle log book. All vehicles must comply with RACMSA Technical Regulations. Vehicles may be presented which are not taxed for use on a public highway, however, such untaxed cars must have a valid registration document and MOT certificate which will be inspected at scrutineering as defined by K42.8.1

Trophies will be presented as follows: 1st, 2nd and 3rd Overall, then, 1st and 2nd in classes (A),(B),(C) and (D). Best performance by an all female crew or best mixed crew. No competitor may win more than one award from the above list. Awards will be presented at the end of the event, and all named trophies, (a list of which will appear in the final instructions), must be returned to the promoting club after eleven months, or earlier if called for by the promoting club. Additional Awards may be presented at the discretion of the organisers.

Named trophies are as follows:-

1st O/A The Elvington Stages Rally Trophy.

2nd O/A The John Seaton Cup.

3rd O/A The Abbeyside Trophy.

Best mixed or all female crew The Topmix Trophy.

Spirit of the Rally award A Trophy.

The entry list opens on publication of these Supplementary Regulations and closes finally on 1st Sept 1995, the entry fee is £120. Provisional Results will be Published as soon as possible at the finish of the event in accordance with B13.1.

Any protest must be lodged in accordance with 05.1.

Entrants will be supplied with a Road Book and Time Cards when Signing On. Details of all tests and special stages will be issued when Signing On. These documents will provide all the information to enable competitors to comply with K5.2.

Competitors may be required to make up lateness at rest halts. Service vehicles will only be allowed to leave either at the finish of the event or upon the retirement of their competing crew at the discretion of the organisers.18)

Servicing is defined as in P1.2 and K38.3.1. Servicing will be permitted only in the Official Service Area designated by the organisers. All other areas are out of bounds to service crews under pain of exclusion for the associated competing car. Refuelling will only be allowed in the designated refuelling area's, only 1 car will be allowed to refuel in each area at a time. Only one service vehicle per crew will be allowed into the Service area.

Competitors will be identified by black numbers on a white background fixed on both sides of the competing vehicle to be supplied by the competitors, (the black numbers will be on

sale at scrutineering). All rally identification must be removed at the conclusion of the event or upon retirement.

The rally will be a Schedule Timed Event. Penalties as specified in K39.2 apply except the following which are modified:-

- a) Not reporting to a control Exclusion.
- b) Not reporting at or providing proof
- of visiting a check Exclusion.
- c) Not complying with a requirement
- of the Road Book or Route Card including

visiting a control more than once Exclusion.

d) Not complying with a reasonable instruction of an official provided a warning is given that a penalty will be applied

Cars may be fitted with a limited slip differential.

All vehicles must carry an S.O.S. board and an 'OK' board.

- It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that his/her time card is correctly completed before departing from a control. All sign boards are mandatory.
- Any competitor whom it is proven to the organisers satisfaction, has been practising or conducting a reconnaissance on any of the roads used as stages will be excluded and reported to the RACMSA Ltd.
- 27) Spectators will NOT be allowed.
- Final instructions will be posted to drivers or navigators not less than forty eight hours before the event and will have the same force as these S.R.s.
- Competitors may be required, at the discretion of the organisers, to allow re-grouping of the entries due to retirements.
- It is imperative that Competing Crews and the Service Crews travel quietly and slowly to the venue. Anyone reported infringing this requirement will be penalised and may be excluded. This is a PR sensitive area and your co-operation will help future events being possible.

It was conceived by York Motor Club as a bit of extra fun and a way of Single Venue Stage Rally organisers locally filling up their entries. It is based on four events Yorks Single Venue Stage Rally on Elvington on the 11th March, Selby's Single Venue Stage Rally on the 2nd September, Maltons Single Venue Stage Rally on Wombleton on the 22nd October and Trackrods Single Venue Stage Rally at Melbourne on the 5th November. All of these are cheap events and all will be organised to common regulations designed to keep the costs down. championship regulations ban Four Wheel Drive and induction. Points scoring is based on the Larkspeed League system where you score points based on the number of people in class that you beat. It only costs £5.00 for each crew member to enter and at the end of the year there are trophies to the Driver and Navigator who achieve 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 1st in each of the classes.
